1. Total visits to the Nursing Offices for the 2003-2004 school year: 130,635 students were seen in

- Referrals: 14,543 students were referred to primary care providers for further care and/or treatment of communicable diseases, illnesses, injuries, psychiatric disorders, vision, hearing, and dental needs. There has been an increase of referrals by 3,460 or approximately 24% during this school year.
- 3. Attendance Students returned to class: 130,635 students were seen in the nursing offices this year. 122,522 or 93.7% were returned to the academic environment.
- Parental Involvement: The nursing staff has documented 12,810 parental contacts this year. This
 is an increase of approximately 53%. This does not include parental contacts made at health fairs,
 open houses, etc.
- 5. Employee Health: Greater than 3,240 employees were seen for health related issues.
- 6. Immunizations for students to be admitted to schools: The nursing staff in the district provided **2,767 immunizations to students, during school hours.** If this service were not available many of these students would have missed class to receive mandated immunizations.
- Suicide Risk, Pregnancy Related: **44,671 screening events** occurred during the school year. *This is approximately 25% more screenings than the previous school.*
