Governor Susana Martinez and Secretary-Designate of Education Hanna Skandera are committed to partnering to ensure students are ready for success and are establishing strong fiscal and academic accountability to yield a smarter return on taxpayers' investment in education. The New Mexico Public Education Department (PED), Student Nutrition Bureau is pleased to inform you that one or more of your schools has been selected to participate in the Fresh Fruit Vegetable Program (FFVP), through the Food Conservation and Energy Act of 2008, for SY 2012- 2013. Please take note of the following federal grant information specific to the award you are receiving through PED.

The total allocation for FFVP is divided into two obligation and expenditure periods:

- 1. The first allocation is to be obligated and expended during July 1, 2012 through September 30, 2012.
- 2. The second allocation is to be obligated and expended during October 1, 2012 through June 30,

The funds allocated for each period are specific to expenditures for that period only. Funds awarded within the first period's allocation are to be obligated and expended for that period only; they cannot be carried over. The July 2012 allocation must be obligated by September 30, 2012. Funds awarded within the second allocation must be expended by the grant period ending June 30, 2013.

Use of Funds

Funds are to be used primarily to purchase fresh fruits and vegetables to be made available at no charge at a minimum of twice a week. Funds must follow the basic guidelines of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-87 and must be necessary and reasonable. A school may use up to 10% of the funds for administrative costs or indirect cost in accordance with OMB A-87. Please note that labor costs associated with preparing and distributing the fruits and vegetables are not considered administrative costs. Labor costs should be shown as operating costs which must be reasonable and necessary in accordance with OMB A-87. The program should be structured so that the maximum benefits go to students.

Expectations of Participating Schools

- 1. Publicize the availability of free fresh fruits and vegetables to the student body a minimum of twice a week.
- 2. Begin the program at the beginning of the new school year.
- 3. Make fresh fruits and vegetables available to all elementary students throughout the school day as a supplement to (and not part of) the school breakfast and school lunch programs.
- 4. Provide nutrition education activities related to benefits of having fresh fruits and vegetables as
- 5. Submit a monthly claim for reimbursement.
